It also gives an introductory account of the monetary and fiscal policies; budget and trade deficits; and exchange rate.

Eco 134: Applied Mathematics I - This course discusses application of some of the introductory level mathematical principles in Business and Economics. Topics include Modeling, Curve sketching, Matrix, Limits and continuity, Differentiation, comparative statics and their application in Business and Economics. Aim of this course is to introduce basic mathematical concepts to understand their applications and to prepare students for introducing higher level mathematical concepts.

Eco 244: Applied Mathematics II - This course discusses application of some of the intermediate level mathematical principles in Business and Economics.
